The latest information I have, Gary, is that there is actually a net decrease of people living in unincorporated land, though would have to dig a little deeper into the census numbers to confirm. I compiled this table about 18 months ago based on all the census data back to 1950, plus the Census 2014 estimate.

It shows that there is a drop in population, not just in percentage but in real numbers, in all areas outside of the city limits of American Canyon and Napa between 1990 and 2010, though there was a small estimated uptick between 2010 and 2013. I don't have the specific data on the cities, but I know that both Calistoga and St. Helena have grown at least some in numbers since 1990, and I assume Yountville is at least the same, perhaps larger now, so it stands to reason that there is a real decrease in population of the unincorporated area over the last 30 years. If I have time, I will update this chart with city-level data to test my assumption.
